### Pastor's Letter



#### Growing Disciples Deep and Wide: Our 2026 Church Theme

Dear church family,

As we step into this new year, allow me to share the theme that our Lord has placed on my heart for 2026. Our church is embracing a simple, life-shaping focus: **"Growing disciples deep in love for God and wide in serving Him and His people."** This biblical foundation, rooted in the Great Commandment and Great Commission, emphasizes that this is more than a slogan; it is a way of life we want to practice together in worship, community, and everyday mission.

Two key Scriptures shape this calling: the Great Commandment and the Great Commission. Rooted in Matthew 22 and 28, they remind us that a healthy church is both deeply rooted in God's love and reaching widely with it, inspiring trust in our biblical foundation.

#### Growing Deep: Great Commandment

Jesus said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind... and love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37–39) To grow deep means our roots sink into Christ, so love for God shapes our decisions, habits, priorities, relationships, and character.

#### Growing Wide: Great Commission

Jesus also sends us out: "Go and make disciples of all nations... teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19–20) To grow wide means our faith moves beyond the church walls into our neighborhoods, workplaces, schools, and city, sharing the Good News and serving others in Jesus' name.

This theme is for everyone in our church family. The question is not, "Am I already a disciple?" but "How is Jesus growing me deeper in love and wider in service this year?" We are all invited to participate actively in this spiritual journey, fostering a sense of purpose and involvement.

Let us walk this path together in 2026, trusting Jesus' promise: "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:20). Embrace opportunities to grow deeper and broader in your faith and service this year.

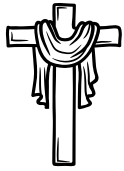


**GOLDEN WEDS RECEPTION**

This Lent, we will journey through the events in Jesus’ life that led to His death on the cross, listening again to the Scriptures that tell the story of His love and sacrifice, inviting you to deepen your faith and feel more connected to His sacrifice.

Together, we will pay close attention to several key characters and the roles they played in the crucifixion - His disciples (Luke 22:39–62), Caiaphas and the religious leaders (Matthew 26:57–68), Pilate (John 18:28–19:16), Barabbas (Mark 15:6–15), and the Marys at the cross and the tomb (John 19:25–27; Luke 23:49–56; Matthew 28:1–10)-to deepen our understanding and emotional connection to this story.

I hope you will join us as we look back on this powerful, life-changing story and draw near to Christ in worship, repentance, and renewed faith during this holy season.

## LIVE STREAM



How to Access the Live Stream  
(Step by Step)  
Computer Access

1. Turn on computer.
2. Open web browser. (ie. Chrome, Firefox, or Internet Explorer)
3. Click into the address bar at the top of the screen.
4. Type [www.stlukelincoln.org](http://www.stlukelincoln.org) and press enter.
5. Scroll down and click on the red underlined phrase which says, “CLICK HERE FOR THE LIVESTREAM.” This will take you to our YouTube channel.
6. You are able to leave comments on the right. (You will need to sign in to leave a comment.)

### Phone Access

1. On your phone you can follow the same steps as above.
2. If you don’t already have the YouTube app on your phone, it may ask you to install it. Once installed, follow the steps above again and it should open the YouTube page and click on the video with the red “live” next to it.



Text announcements will remind you when livestream is starting on Sunday morning, special events, when we have to cancel church or events due to weather, etc.

### PLEASE SIGN UP!

1. Open your text messaging app on your phone and start a new message.
2. In the spot where you put the person’s phone number (To:) type: 43506
3. In the spot where you type the message, type the word: announce.
4. Press send. If you did it correctly, you should get a response within a minute that says, “Welcome to St. Luke UMC announcements.”
