## Operation Christmas Child Year-Round Shoebox Shopping

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. They ship these simple gifts outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease.

St. Luke participates in this outreach instead of other "Christmas in July" programs. We collect items throughout the year, and then place them in the Christmas-wrapped box in the narthex. This is a great opportunity to purchase items when they are at sale prices, and then it's one less thing to do during the busy Christmas season.

## Spring is here!!!

The garden is starting to produce. Right now, we have cilantro and radishes ready for use. The rhubarb plant was separated and is

growing but no rhubarb will be available this year. We have planted beets, carrots, spinach, kohlrabi, romaine, broccoli, squash, cabbage, pole bean and cucumbers. We will be planting tomatoes and peppers in the next couple of weeks. Again, this year we will be having a work night on Wednesdays at 7:00 PM starting on June 4, 2025. We will be pulling weeds, thinning the carrots, beets, kohlrabi, working on training the zucchini to grow up, instead of spreading out, and training the summer squash, pole beans, and cucumbers to climb the trellises. Gardens take time and work. If you are interested in helping please contact Mary Kulhanek or the church office. The Sharing Table will be open on Sundays in the Fellowship Hall from 9:45 AM – 10:45 AM when produce is available.

## LIVE STREAM



How to Access the Live Stream (Step by Step) Computer Access

- 1. Turn on computer.
- 2. Open web browser. (ie. Chrome, Firefox, or Internet Explorer)
- 3. Click into the address bar at the top of the screen.
- 4. Type www.stlukelincoln.org and press enter.
- 5. Scroll down and click on the red underlined phrase which says, "CLICK HERE FOR THE LIVESTREAM." This will take you to our YouTube channel.
- 6. You are able to leave comments on the right. (You will need to sign in to leave a comment.)

#### **Phone Access**

- 1. On your phone you can follow the same steps as above.
- 2. If you don't already have the YouTube app on your phone, it may ask you to install it.

  Once installed, follow the steps above again and it should open the YouTube page and click on the video with the red "live" next to it.

Text announcements will remind you when livestream is starting on Sunday morning, special events, when we have to cancel church or events due to weather, etc.

#### PLEASE SIGN UP!

- 1. Open your text messaging app on your phone and start a new message.
- 2. In the spot where you put the person's phone number (To:) type: 43506
- 3. In the spot where you type the message, type the word: announce.
- 4. Press send. If you did it correctly, you should get a response within a minute that says, "Welcome to St. Luke UMC announcements."
